

During this time of Advent, when we eagerly anticipate Christmas and all that Immanuel God with us means, we as a church will participate in the Advent Conspiracy.



Our culture has made the celebration of Christ's birth a side show from all the secular attractions of gifts and materialism. In some ways we as believers have bought into the pressure. Yes, we all love giving and receiving gifts, but during this season let's remember that Jesus is the greatest gift of all. He is the Reason for the Season.

During the four Sundays of Advent we will focus on 4 key players--the cast of characters--in the unfolding drama of the Incarnation. We look at Mary, the mother of Jesus and how she opened up herself to be a vessel of God's love and becomes a model that inspires for us to worship Christ.

On the second week of Advent we will take a look at Joseph. The theme we will explore is spending less on ourselves. Certainly the example of Joseph who took care of Mary and Jesus is one that inspires.

The third week we look at the wise men and consider the theme of giving more for the things that really matter. These Magi were not kidding around--they brought costly gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. Let us also consider how we may spend our resources on kingdom ends!

The fourth week we will look at the Shepherds, these humble sheep herders who come to the manger too, because they are invited by the angels to bear witness to the King. These are truly the forgotten ones! But not by God. These last, last, lost and lonely souls are the very ones



Let's Get Those Wheels Rolling



Update from the Luptons

Area Retreat Update - Thanks to all who prayed specifically for the MTW Latin America and Africa retreat in October. Although we faced more logistical challenges than usual, God worked in beautiful ways to refresh, connect, and grow missionary families. We saw more fruit at this retreat than we have in any of the previous ones that we've been a part of as we saw God provide healing for the emotionally downtrodden, belonging for the uprooted, grace for the shamed, comfort for the victim, and grace-filled instruction for all of us. Our missionary families, especially the children, need our prayers continually.

United Church of Bogotá - God has been at work here in Bogotá as well. Thank you for praying for us as Andrew has taken on solo pastor responsibilities at UCB. Despite our inexperience and weakness, we have seen church attendance explode over the last few months. On October 26th we welcomed 18 new members and installed 2 new ruling elders. We're also seeing God knit our congregation together, forming a community that is growing together in grace and truth. Please keep Andrew and the church leadership in your prayers as they work together to guide the church.

UCB Children's Ministry - Last year about this time, we wrote about a new beginning for children's ministry at UCB – a ministry that had been dormant for a long time. We started out fall of 2013 with an attendance of 4 students. God has been pleased to grow this ministry by leaps and bounds over the past few months! We now have over 40 students on our roll, with 25-30 showing up every Sunday morning for elementary and preschool classes. Please pray for Laura Kate and the children's ministry team as they pour into these precious kids, and as they make plans for new classes and curriculum for next year to accommodate this rapid growth.
