

#### December 2015

Advent is the time of year when we as Christians prepare our hearts anew to celebrate Christ's incarnation. As the familiar words of the old carol go: O holy Child of Bethlehem Descend to us, we pray. Cast out our sin and enter in. Be born to us today.



This Advent season at Providence we will celebrate the tradition of Advent wreath lighting. The first Sunday we look at Prophecy, and remember how Christ was foretold in the Hebrew Scriptures. Specifically in the words of Isaiah, "For Unto us a child is born and unto us a son is given and His name shall be called Wonderful Counselor Almighty God Everlasting Father the Prince of Peace". Let us look eagerly for Jesus! The second Sunday we ignite the candle of the Angels and note the annunciation as Gabriel tells Mary that she will have a son, and "His name will be called Jesus for He shall save his people from their sins". Let us remember that He came to redeem us. The third week of the season we will look at the Shepherds who received the glad tidings and made haste to the stable to see Jesus with their own eyes. Let us consider the gospel and encounter afresh the Christ. The Sunday before Christmas we look at the Wise-men who brought gifts of gold, frankingense and myrrh to our Lord. Let us bring our gifts to the feet of Jesus. And on Christmas Eve we light the Christ candle, for Jesus is the Light of the World. Let us walk in the light--in fellowship with Him and with one another.

### Mission News



#### Excerpts from Roes Newsletter:

#### Kairos Moment

"We are living in a Kairos moment" is what our co-workers Jeff and Carrie



Gage in Germany are telling us. A God moment, the Greek Bible word means – the right or opportune moment (the supreme moment). "It's just like when the Berlin wall came down, the ground is shifting but the potential for the Gospel is incredible, and the church in Europe is waking up."

This isn't the usual report you hear on the news when covering the European refugee crisis. The glimpses of human desperation are heart wrenching. Receiving countries trapped between moral imperative/humanitarian responses and challenged fiscal resources and internal political concerns. From a human perspective, the challenges and obstacles are overwhelming with 8,000-10,000 more arriving every day.

The only way this makes sense is to ask the Lord to give us His perspective. We've been praying for years that that God would bring revival to Europe and God is doing an amazing thing right now. Churches, denominations, Christian organizations and migrant churches are working together to mobilize a response. This may be a brief window- but it feels like the church in Europe is waking up a bit.

We've also been praying that God would give us greater access to the peoples of the Middle East and North Africa. They are coming! Many disillusioned by ISIS and Islam, traumatized by the journey, refugees are responding to the kindness of God's people (a very different perception of Christianity). God is both breathing a fresh wind into the European church and providing a window of unprecedented access in this "Kairos" moment.

For Courtney and I, the situation for us in Europe is changing rapidly. When we left in June there was 1 refugee camp within 20 minutes of our home in Kandern. Now there are 4, with a 5th in the works. Our co-workers we mentioned above, Jeff and Carrie, are heavily engaged. Jeff works with eDOT and Carrie has been become a leader in the local response to the refugees in Germany.

eDOT is also working through some of the ways that technology can engage with this unprecedented opportunity. There is a network of Christian ministries emerging all along the "Syrian Highway" – the predominant pathway that people are coming through. The idea is to connect refugees through a "Safe Passage Hotline" and help them connect to the next place that they can receive help. We're not sure exactly eDOT's involvement just yet but exploring the whole concept.

Our mission, GEM, is also mobilizing as we have people at both the entry ports and the destination cities that these refugees want to get to. When you have nothing, it's so great to hear, "When you get to Cologne, look these people up, you'll find friendship and help."

So even though we are far away our hearts and minds are on what is going on in Germany and in Europe. Pray for us as we listen, learn, dream, pray, engage, work and hang on for the ride!E

#### Excerpt from the Luptons Newlsetter

Here are some sound bites from our lives last month:

"I believe in God and Jesus and the Holy Spirit and stuff, but I'm just not sure that all this isn't made up," admitted Katherine, a 16-year-old member of our youth group. "I mean, how can I know that this isn't just a story like all the other stories out there? What if it's not true?" Laura Kate and Katherine are meeting



regularly to talk through ways in which considering Christianity cannot be casual, that it will deeply impact everything about her life.

"I don't think God could forgive me for everything that I've done," reflected Paula, a University Student who approached Andrew after a worship service. They were able to talk about how Jesus' costly sacrifice was enough to forgive everything that Paula has done, does, and will do. Paula prayed to receive Jesus that afternoon, but we haven't seen much of her since then. Many people like Paula struggle because they may be the only Christians in their family, school, and workplace.

"What exactly is 'Christian Art'?" asked Ana, a university student studying art. Everything she grew up and believed about Christianity has come under the scrutiny of her professors and classmates over the past two years and now she's questioning her beliefs and calling. "What you said about God never loving me more or less than he already does in his Son, Jesus, really stuck out to me. I have a hard time believing that because I'm not a good person anymore."

The most encouraging encounter comes from John, who when we started writing this update wasn't a believer. He teaches law at a prestigious university in Bogotá. John, who survived not one but two near fatal encounters with Pablo Escobar, is starting to connect the dots about how God has shown up in his story. Andrew was able to challenge him, "John, I think God is after your heart." We were going to ask you to pray for John's salvation, but God broke in and converted John on Sunday after the service. "I believe in Jesus now and I'm ready to give my life to him."

We've said this before, but we think we have the best jobs in the world and we cannot thank you enough for partnering with us to reach the nations and the next generation!

#### Update from the McKays

The refugee crisis continues to command our attention, especially in the light of the Paris attacks. Part of what is coming to the surface is the difference between the world's response of revenge and closing things up and the kingdom of God which 'sees' an opportunity like nothing else right now. Interestingly, Sandra traveled on a train from Germany with a refugee family last week that was (gently) removed from the train at the Swiss border... they thought they could travel over the border without issue. The fields are ripe



among these refugees, many fleeing manifold oppressions and facing other challenges in their new 'home.'

We continue our process of pursuing our calling to Europe through the EPC, with whom I am ordained. On the first weekend of December, Sandra and I will be heading up to Michigan to an Encounter weekend to meet some missions people and get some questions asked and answered. Please pray for revelation through the process. There is then a lot of paperwork (it is Presbyterian!) and such to be done as it unfolds. It is our hope that this will speed the process for getting on the field and will provide covering and administrative support.
