

The Search Process: Part 2

In Part 1 of the Search Process, The Congregational or Church Information Form (CIF) and the Pastor or Personal Information Form (PIF) were discussed. They were referred to as profiles (or snap shots) that were compiled as self assessments. To quote from our EPC information:

"As part of the process of "matching" ministers and congregations, the Office of the Stated Clerk provides resources and advice to both pastors and congregational search committees. To that end, we ask congregations and ministers to complete information forms as an introduction to each other, and a first step in the process of calling a minister for a congregation. For both the individual pastor and the congregation, this is an opportunity for self- study and for evaluation of current ministry and goals. This calls for honesty, effort, and commitment to open communication. The Personal Information Form (PIF) presents the unique skills, gifts, and experiences of a pastor. It is also important to keep in mind that these Information Forms (CIF & PIF) are an initial introduction. The second phase of the process will be more in depth interviews with those who appear to be most compatible with the congregation's vision."

Focusing on Providence and our CIF for a moment, and using the previous statement "this is an opportunity for self-study and for evaluation of current ministry and goals," as a guide. Let's do a little self focus and evaluation. Definitionally speaking our mission is our purpose. Our vision is where we see ourselves at any given time in relationship to our mission. What is Providence's mission statement or purpose for existing? Is our mission broad or narrow and does it have a scriptural basis? What are the vision and goals of Providence? How do we go about formulating a vision or goals? Is it the responsibility of the new Pastor? The Session? The Congregation? Once formulated and adopted by the congregation - do we have a responsibility to monitor our progress towards them? As an example lets examine Know-Grow-Go which is our most current mission statement in its simplest form. Can the majority of the Congregation

articulate its meaning? Would new members or visitors readily recognize and grasp its meaning or purpose? Are we using that phrase as a mission statement or as a slogan? How are we holding ourselves accountable and measuring our progress towards Know-Grow-Go, or any of our goals? Individually are we spiritually maturing in The Faith? Have you ever wondered -Why do we do what we do? Is our mission statement well stated and defined and acting as an over arching purpose that guides us and all of our actions and activities, or are we just going thru the motions of being "a Church"? Was Providence established with the purpose of being another small church in Haywood County? If not, how do we go about sharing the Good News of the Gospel with others and having them want to join us in our mission? How do we make Providence and its mission relevant in all of our lives? These are questions for all of us to reflect on when performing our self study.

Shining the light of self study on our budget for a moment. Potential candidates will have our current and previous budgets as a study tool. Most of us would probably agree that the Works or Deeds that proceed from our Faith speak louder than our words. Candidates can study our resources, and how we allocate those resources. What is the condition of our facility (even if leased)? Does the facility have the ability to accommodate growth? Do we desire to grow? Is Providence entirely self focused or does it have an external focus such as missions and other out reach programs?

Why all of these probing questions about our vision and our goals? If we agree that God is calling a pastor with the "unique skills, gifts and experiences", that will help lead us in achieving our goals, vision or mission, then clearly defining and articulating the Providence mission, will make it easier for us to recognize and identify who that person is. The Search Committee will soon complete and post the Providence CIF. Potential candidates will then start reviewing our CIF and making assessments about us as a congregation and the position we have available. After much prayer, those sensing a call will complete and send in their PIFs - "the initial introduction. The second phase of the Search Committee process will be, with much prayer, reviewing and the narrowing of the candidates to those who appear to be most compatible with the congregations vision."

In Part 3 we will continue the discussion about the Search Process starting with the narrowing of the candidates.

Thoughts About God's Vision for Providence Church

But what would Jesus desire for us to accomplish in our community for the kingdom? Jesus says we are to be a light in the darkness. Do we let our light shine as a church? Do we share our love for each other with our community so they can see that we truly have the love of Christ in us? "For God, who said, Let there be light in the darkness, has made this light shine in our hearts so we could know the glory of God that is seen in the face of Jesus Christ." 2 Corinthians 4:6.

As Michael Youssef quoted in his article: "The word for "call" in this verse means to do so continuously. We are commanded to ask continuously until God reveals His vision to us. Persistence teaches us to rely on God while He is shaping our hearts to delight in Him. God does a wonderful work in us when we seek His will. As we seek Him for His will, we learn who He is and we begin to delight in Him and His will rather than our own. As He becomes the desire of our hearts, we are aligned and ready to receive His will and vision for our lives."

As I desperately try to separate my life from the "world" and to seek a more spiritual life of commitment to our Lord, I trust God will connect me with those needing His love. Please join the Session in continual prayer asking God to reveal His vision for Providence Church.

Mideast Update - Highlights of 2013

We wanted to share some of highlights of 2013 as we live and serve here in the Middle East. We are so thankful the ways you care about us...so this might give you some insight into our lives.

- * God has protected! We can't write details...but we felt pressures this year as we work in a country without religious freedom. Our names were under scrutiny because of connections with those who have chosen to follow Jesus. We don't feel any fear, but we know His banner is over us.
- * God has sustained! Our co-workers and neighbors had a devastating house fire. They escaped with only one broken arm. The community gathered, and repaired their house in one week, opening powerful doors for the gospel to be proclaimed. A week later, their son chopped off his finger tip...and the Lord has completely healed that finger.
- * God has been a friend!—All the time, we have friends that come and go from our lives. Our girls constant prayer has been for friends. God has shown us more and more how He is so loving to us Himself. Just when we have felt the loneliness...He has given us good friends and family visits to encourage us.
- * God has shown up! Last month, a young Arab lady died at 8 months pregnant. She was a big part of our women's program. Lisa was asked to share scripture and pray at her Muslim friend's funeral. God moved and doors were blown open to share how we get to Heaven through Christ.
- * God has been faithful! He has provided for us in meaningful ways. As one church had to limit their support, the same month another church wrote they were increasing...the exact amount needed. He is the Master Accountant!

It is a privilege to do what we are doing. Our greatest joy is to see lives changed by Christ...and we see Him moving. Pray for more in 2014

In 2013, a record 9.95 million Christmas shoe boxes were collected worldwide, with more than 7.5 million from the U.S. (up from 6.5 million in 2012)! For the second year in a row, Haywood County increased the number of shoe boxes it provided by more than 20 percent, providing over 4,500 boxes in 2013.
