

The Search Process Part VI

The search committee continues its work and is looking forward to the moment it can present a candidate to the Providence Session. Until that moment comes I would like to digress and have you consider the following somber articles while reflecting on - the cost of following Christ or what is referred to as being a Christian.

As violent persecution against Christians around the world intensifies, Ronald S. Lauder, president of the World Jewish Congress, in a recent op-ed bluntly asks, "Why is the world silent while Christians are being slaughtered in the Middle East and Africa?"

"In Europe and in the United States, we have witnessed demonstrations over the tragic deaths of Palestinians who have been used as human shields by Hamas, the terrorist organization that controls Gaza," wrote Lauder in his piece published in The New York Times. "The United Nations has held inquiries and focuses its anger on Israel for defending itself against that same terrorist organization. But the barbarous slaughter of thousands upon thousands of Christians is met with relative indifference". Why is the world silent?

Lauder leads the World Jewish Congress, which is an international organization that represents Jewish communities and organizations in 100 countries around the world. In the op-ed, he notes that in the Middle East and in parts of central Africa, entire Christian communities are being lost in areas where peace had previously prevailed for centuries.

"The terrorist group Boko Haram has kidnapped and killed hundreds of Christians this year — ravaging the predominantly Christian town of Gwoza, in Borno State in northeastern Nigeria, two weeks ago," he states. "Half a million Christian Arabs have been driven out of Syria during the three-plus years of civil war there. Christians have been persecuted and killed in countries from Lebanon to Sudan."

International Christian Concern Regional Manager for Africa -Cameron Thomas said that "far too many" Christians have been "martyred, displaced, and terrorized at the hands of armed extremist."

The Nigerian terrorist group Boko Haram is the latest to declare an "Islamic Caliphate" in the predominantly Christian town of Gwoza, which it seized earlier in August and slaughtered over 100 civilians.

"For years, Boko Haram has waged a campaign of terror against Christians, moderate Muslims, educators and students, and law enforcement and military personnel for the establishment of a separate Islamic state; which, today, they felt capable of declaring. Such a declaration should serve as rallying point for the international community to come together and lend its full support to the Nigerian state in its battle against Boko Haram, and all other extreme ideologies plaguing the stability of not only that state, but the entire region. We mourn with the families of those brutally executed on camera, and join with others in praying for the security and well-being of those under the oppressive hand of the world's newest self-declared regime." Thomas stated.

If the United States, and if especially Christians within the country, are supposed to lead the world in the fight against this sort of escalating oppression, then they may have to get educated on the matter first, observed a Christian persecution leader.

Open Doors USA president David Curry told The Christian Post as he took office last year, "The biggest challenge I think we are going to face is trying to get the American church to understand the scale and the magnitude of persecution around the world their brothers and sisters are facing today. We are so far removed, even with modern technology, from the kinds of punishment and persecution that people are facing in these countries like North Korea, Afghanistan, Saudi Arabia, and so forth that I'm not sure we can get our minds around it."

However, even leaders and organizations that know the gravity of the situation appear to be silent, according to Lauder. "The United Nations has been mostly mum. World leaders seem to be consumed with other matters in this strange summer of 2014," he writes. "There are no flotillas traveling to Syria or Iraq. And as for the beautiful celebrities, and aging rock stars why doesn't the slaughter of Christians seem to register with their social antennas?"

After explaining that the Islamic State in Iraq and Syria (ISIS) is "not a loose coalition of jihadist groups, but a real military force that has managed to take over much of Iraq" and "uses money from banks and gold shops it has captured, along with control of oil resources and old-fashioned extortion, to finance its killing machine, making it perhaps the wealthiest Islamist terrorist group in the world," Lauder says, "...the general indifference to ISIS, with its mass executions of Christians and its deadly preoccupation with Israel, isn't just wrong; it's obscene." It's Evil.

Christians have been targeted by ISIS, which had long been aiming at forming an Islamic emirate in the Levant, a region also known as the Eastern Mediterranean, through "jihad." The militant outfit has asked minorities to flee, convert to Islam, or be killed.

Army Gen. Martin Dempsey, chairman of the Joint Chiefs of - continued on next page -

Staff and Americas top ranking military officer told a news conference recently. "This is an organization that has an apocalyptic, end-of-days strategic vision and which will eventually have to be defeated, Can they be defeated without addressing that part of their organization which resides in Syria? The answer is no. That will have to be addressed on both sides of what is essentially at this point a nonexistent border.

Lauder writes that during a speech before thousands of Christians in Budapest in June, he made a "solemn promise" that just as he "will not be silent in the face of the growing threat of anti-Semitism in Europe and in the Middle East, [he] will not be indifferent to Christian suffering. Historically, it has almost always been the other way around: Jews have all too often been the persecuted minority ... Christians can openly practice their religion in Israel, unlike in much of the Middle East," Lauder states. "We share much more than most religions, We read the same Bible, and share a moral and ethical core. Now, sadly, we share a kind of suffering: Christians are dying because of their beliefs, because they are defenseless and because the world is indifferent to their suffering. The Jewish people understand all too well what can happen when the world is silent. This campaign of death must be stopped."

I (Thom) am grieved by the suffering and dying of my Brothers and Sisters in Christ around the world. It is apparently difficult for the world to recognize and confront such hatred and Evil. At the same time the power of God is displayed thru these very same Christians as they are enabled to be a witness of their faith in Christ rather than renounce Him - even at the cost of their very own lives. May we approach our

Sovereign God and petition him to raise up the ones, that will confront and defeat this latest Manifestation of Evil. Nations must continue to go to war to achieve peace - yet there is no lasting peace. Only the Prince of Peace can provide the True Peace that the world is in need of. Until that time - The Cost is indeed high for some of those following Christ.



MidEast Update - Focus on Kids

We wanted to focus this newsletter on asking for prayer for our kids and the Arab children around us.

A big change is coming! Lisa will home school Natalie (8 years old) while the other two girls remain at a local British/Arab school. After educational testing, we became aware that Natalie needs help in assimilating information in ways the local school isn't prepared to offer. Honestly, we feel a bit inadequate to give Natalie all that she needs.

So, we are calling all teachers to please be in prayer for both Natalie and Lisa. Thankfully, we'll be back in the US Jan-June 2015 to get more help and resources. We purchased some good curriculum that has come highly recommended. Let us know what you feel or hear during your prayer times concerning this!

This summer we have helped take care of two Bedouin babies at the health clinic. Dina is now a thriving 6 month old who was a severely malnourished twin 3 months ago. Her mother had Tuberculosis and couldn't keep up with her 8 children, tent life, and daily milking of the goats. Moe was a month premature. He was discharged from the hospital last week, and then found on the dirt floor of a tin shack being watched over by his 2 year old brother. These babies are now living at the clinic until their families can better care for them. Pray for these babies and their families to find HOPE!

For the last year, Lance has been directing a youth camp for underprivileged Arab youth. For the last two weeks, they had a special summer camp. It was great fun taking desert jeep rides, English lessons, and even teaching CPR. Pray for the 102 participants who will be influenced by this program and are the future of the Arab world.

Thanks so much for praying for our children and those around us! We are headed back to the US at Christmas until June 2015. We'll be based in Wilmington, NC...but we'd love a chance to see you if possible.
