


Set clocks back I hour Saturday night, Nov 1st

Let's Get those Wheels Rolling! Prayer Requests From the Lizarazus:


Emily recently wrote that prior to leaving to come on furlough last year, they had to sell the old "beater" car that she drove around town because the doors kept falling off! Now that they have returned to Bolivia they only have one car. When Eric has groups out at camp, two hours from their house, his family can't go to camp with him because they have to wait till later in the week until school is over. In the past the family would all be able to go to camp on the weekends with Eric. Emily would help cook and minister to the campers and the Lizarazu kids were able to join in the activities and did not have to be away from their father for days or weeks at a time.

In the busy season, December, Eric will be in LaPaz (five hours away) for 12 days and Emily will be without a car. Since she take the kids to school, activities and church functions, it will be difficult to work out transportation. She is asking for prayer and donations at this time. There are three main churches in the U.S. that support the Lizarazu and Providence is one of those three. She is hoping if each church could raise around a thousand dollars, they would be able to afford a second car.

Batter Up!

It's been a whirlwind three months since you last heard about our adventures and the exciting gospel partnership that we're all a part of. Where to begin...



When we last wrote you we told you that there had been a number of curveballs recently thrown our way. Who were we kidding? Because days after our correspondence we were tossed a real 12-6 yellow hammer (sorry for the baseball slang, the Cardinals are in the playoffs). As you know, most of our work here in Bogotá has been through the United Church of Bogotá, an English-speaking international church that serves people from all over the planet. Andrew has served as the pastor of youth and families at this church but is now the lone pastor following the sudden resignation of the senior pastor with whom he served.

We absolutely love serving here and have seen much exciting momentum in and through the church since we arrived. Was it in our five-year plan for Andrew to be preaching every week, recruiting and training elders, and shepherding a wonderfully complex community of expat children and adults? No. But we have seen God move in such clear ways before, during, and after this strange transition that we are convinced that we are where we need to be for now. We covet your prayers nonetheless:

- For wisdom. Both Laura Kate and Andrew are often in very heavy counseling settings with students and adults in which we need much sensitivity and guidance.
- For strategy. We've seen explosive growth in the last few months, but do not yet have the infrastructure in the church to handle it.

• For skill. Andrew is still a very young preacher, pastor, and leader and the opportunities and responsibilities in this new role are tremendous and overwhelming at times.

• For fruit. As the church, youth group, and children's ministries grow, so do the number of non-believers we are regularly engaging with the Gospel.

The Home Team

We had a phenomenal time serving our missionary families this summer at MTW's Reconnect and Summer Conferences at Ridge Haven. Anytime you gather missionary kids together, beautiful things happen. But this event was the most impactful we've seen in a long time.
